How do they do that? Phil Barber

Having recently watched the America's cup boats going a bit fast I began to wonder...

I mean 7 tonnes of boat, larger than a tennis court, balancing on one leg and going more than 40 knots in 20 knots of the wind sounds a bit far-fetched.

Yachts and ships have a fundamental barrier (a bit like the sound barrier) which they cannot breakthrough. As they move through the water they create a bow wave. To go faster they have to climb this wave but going faster makes this wave bigger. It's a catch 22 situation, adding more power does not result in going much faster. Stretching the boat increases the wavelength of the bow wave thereby reducing its gradient so you can go a bit faster but sooner than you'd like you hit that wall of water again. Many dinghies solve this problem by having a flat section of the hull at the back. This allows them to surf on that pesky lump of water at front. The boat does have to be light enough to haul its self out of the water so no nice heavy keels to keep you upright! Multihulls have another option. Slim pointy javelin shaped hulls that spear through the waves. Another option is don't let your boat near the water at all. You "fly" it on a hydroplane.





Now that you have removed the speed limits how fast can you actually go? The America's cup boats were typically going downwind at more than twice the speed of the wind that drove them. Even upwind they could match the wind-speed. With a square rigged ship this is unheard of. The sails are mounted at right angles, or "square", to the keel and act as baffles to the wind. The air flow is turbulent and energy transfer is inefficient. In fore & aft rigs Mr Bernoulli's principle applies. The wing shaped sail is sucked along by the reduced pressure of smoothly flowing accelerated air.

As the boat moves forward it creates its own head wind, this shifts the direction the wind appears to be coming from to the front. An efficient fore & aft rigged boat can sail at perhaps 30° off the wind direction. A more rigid wing can do better than this with useful forward thrust at angles as little as 10°.

If the limiting factor for the speed of the boat is the angle of this apparent wind rather than the friction of water on the hull or the size of the bow wave then we could send for Mr Pythagoras to do some sums for us. Unfortunately I believe he died a while back so we could instead model the situation with bits of coloured string. If you start on a beam reach with the true wind at 90° (at right angles) to the boat and accelerate until the wind appears 30° off the bow you will be going at 1.7 times the speed of the wind. With the true wind at 120° you can achieve double the wind speed. The America's cup boats with their high tech wing sails could sail with better efficiency and higher speeds than these figures indicate.





Lower right: - Hydrofoiling International Moth




Quiz question What is the speed record for a sail driven vehicle?

On March 26, 2009, the Ecotricity Greenbird set a new world land speed record for wind powered vehicles of 126.2 mph. It has a tall wing like sail able to deliver forward thrust at very low angles to the wind achieving speeds 3 to 5 times greater than the wind driving it.



How to keep your Steward Happy — by Maggie Poulson

- Firstly, please remember that all stewards are volunteers and have a life other than the Boating Group.
- Please phone or email the steward if you are interested in attending a meet. Listen to any restrictions or special circumstances to do with the site, don't assume that they don't apply to you. Then, as soon as possible, send to them what they request to confirm your booking. This may include a booking form, fee and a stamped addressed envelope.
- Stewards claim all out of pocket expenses, so if they have to provide photocopies, envelopes & postage this is paid for from the Boating Group finances.
- Do complete all parts of the Booking Form, including your estimated time of arrival.
- Do let the steward know a.s.a.p. if your circumstances or unit change.
- Don't arrive before the site opening time or plan to leave late on the last day.
- Do listen carefully to where you may pitch, sometimes space is limited.
- Do return empty cups if you accept a drink.
- Do let the steward know if you have an accident, however minor.
- Do let the steward know if you have to leave early.
- Do mention if you have a problem, there is usually someone in the group who can help.
- Do volunteer to help with any social events—even better, organise one.
- Do read P. 526-7 of 'Your Big Sites Book and follow all Club regulations stated.
- Do check your pitch for rubbish before leaving the site.
- Do thank the steward for all they do to make your stay enjoyable.

BOATING GROUP EVENTS PROGRAMME

General Information.

The meets programme for 2014 is printed for your reference. Please contact the steward for the latest situation regarding fees, availability, directions etc., before booking. If you haven't been to a BG meet before the procedure is simple.

For **Temporary Holiday Meets** (**THS**) send your booking form (see P.39) with a cheque made payable to the CCC Boating Group to the meets steward (unless specified otherwise) ASAP (and an SAE (if you are not on email) for their reply). If all the places have gone the steward will contact you. You can then either have your cheque back & book another meet or be kept on the waiting list. You can avoid this inconvenience by telephoning —or emailing — the steward first (**recommended**) to confirm a place is available & book it-but you must then send in the cheque & form straight away otherwise you will lose your place (in fairness to other members). **If paying by BACS please include the App Code in the reference-it is included in the meet info —it ends '/ 2014'.**

For **weekend & 5 day meets** you are advised to email or phone the steward first to register your interest and make sure a place is put aside for you (if booking is necessary), then send in a booking form (they can be emailed). **Do not send in any money** (unless specified) with your booking form as fees are usually collected in cash on site.

Remember!! If you have booked a meet and you have to cancel for whatever reason **please**, **please** tell the steward at once. Whether you have paid any money or not is irrelevant. It is polite to email or phone and cancel, since many sites have limited spaces the stewards will almost certainly be able to fill your vacancy from their waiting list if given fair warning. Remember, play fair, one day it could be you on the waiting list!

To contact a steward see P.28. Also look at the committee and contacts pages near the back of the Buccaneer and contact Bob Yates, the Chairman of the Meets Management Committee if you would consider stewarding one of these – or any meets in the future. We are always pleased to receive offers of help with stewarding and there is a 'Meet Pack' for each site which makes the whole job a lot easier. Without stewards there would be no meets and it really isn't that difficult to do. The work of our existing stewards is highly valued and appreciated.

Please note that the fees in the meet details are for a 'unit' of two adults and two children, extra persons *may* have to be paid for.

We seek them here, we seek them there –DO YOU know anyone who could volunteer to — join our committee???? ——-or —-steward a meet?????




