Bala ———by Frank Cooper

For about 16 years my late wife and myself owned and sailed Silhouette Mk V. First on Coniston Water and then on the Walney Channel at Barrow in Furness in Cumbria. Our boat was a 17'3" LOA bilge keel cruiser and we were members of the Roa Island Boating Club based on Roa Island, Cumbria. I decided that after my loss, that I could not handle my boat, particularly at launching and recovery into and out of the water. I could sail alone but it was unfair to keep relying upon my family at launching and recovery. I therefore sold my boat with many regrets.

I decided buy a dinghy that could be sailed as a cruiser on Lake Windermere and other venues where I could act on my own for the most part. I bought a 14'0" Shetlander built by Blue Hulls. The main problem being that I was not a dinghy sailor and had no training or experience in sailing dinghies. However work was required on the boat particularly to the forward and stern locker hatches. Fortunately I have the required skills and keeping her in my garden kept me occupied. Further I joined the South Windermere Sailing Club based at Fell Foot Park, Windermere, Cumbria.

In January 2014 I was facing a problem of planning my first holiday alone with anticipation. However I found that the Boating Group had proposals for a meet for two weeks in July/August on Llyn Tegid, Bala in North Wales. I therefore booked one week, with the view that if it did not work out or the weather intervened then it was only a short distance home. So with much trepidation and alone, I set off for Bala on the 26th July 2014 from my home in Leyland, Lancashire. My journey was simple and uneventful.

Upon arrival I was met by Celia the organiser and was shown to my allotted pitch. I was immediately introduced to my neighbours and made to feel very welcome. My neighbours were a family from Greenwich, London and a family from I think were Lincolnshire. On Sunday I was helped by Paul who with a 4wd car got my boat and trailer onto the beach, we got the mast stepped and rigged and I then explained my dilemma. With various physical difficulties and lack of dinghy experience, I could not sail my boat!. It turned out that Paul had experience in teaching sailing to the disabled. He took me out on Monday afternoon. First he put me into the centre of the boat on the thwartships seat position and with the mainsail only. This with my back to the direction of the direction sailed. Amazingly I was able to cope with this, with further training and time this was an answer to my problem. On Tuesday I was "Pressed" into service as crew in another boat. I have never sailed in company before in my life! Also I had never been in a GP14 before. But in the forward centre position. We sailed slowly but we coped. On Wednesday p.m. we went out again on the lake. We were again successful but with a gusting wind my boat lost two sail battens., which sank. Therefore on Thursday I went to find replacements in Pwllheli. On my return I was told that the "Ice Cream Raid" on Bala that took place p.m. had been a near disaster due to bad weather. I would have liked to have participated but I was not there! Maybe discretion, is the better part of valour?

That was the end of my sailing as I had to return home on Friday. I had promised to take my Cousin to the Bridgewater Hall in Manchester to a "Last Night of the Proms" given by the Halley orchestra.

I would like to thank all who made me so welcome. There were so many names that it was impossible for me to recall nearly all of them. In particular I must thank Celia & Paul, Sarah and her family from Greenwich and I think Brian to my right. To the many others too numerous to remember for the warm welcome that I received and the affection shown by the Many. What I learned that week I can now build upon, my tiller bar has been modified. All I need now is time on the water, probably on Lake Windermere.

This edition's featured Temporary Holiday Site Weymouth , All Saints School, Wyke Regis, Weymouth.

Weymouth was reintroduced into the 2014 programme and by all accounts was highly successful. It does make for the perfect family holiday with something for everyone, great sandy beaches, excellent boating and sailing into Portland Harbour (home of the 2012 Olympics sailing events) which gives sheltered water even in strong wind conditions, perfect for sailors and board sailors. The fleet can be explored by canoe making good use of the tides for an easy passage.

The Group camp on the playing fields of All Saints School from where there are fantastic views across Portland Harbour to Portland. You can even watch the sailing action from your unit. We have use of the school toilets and showers, although many members do prefer their own facilities. Local shops, small supermarket, chemist, bakery and various take-aways are just at the end of the road. Here there is also the local medical centre and library. There will be a varied programme of social events during the THS.



With the site only a few minutes walk to the bus stop or the Rodwell Trail (part of the Long Distance Coastal path) the whole area can be explored without using your own transport. Weymouth town is only ten minutes away by bus or car, or an easy walk or bike ride along the Rodwell Trail. Most of the boating activities take place a short 5 minute ride from the site on the beach adjacent to the boat yard. There is good parking here (small charge payable). From here it is an easy walk to the Fleet visitors centre or along the

shore to Portland Harbour built in the time of Henry 8th (English



Heritage), or along Chesil Beach. An evening walk along the fleet can be a great photo opportunity for those stunning sunsets reflecting in the water.



Weymouth is a bustling town with good shops and a great promenade that still has traditional British entertainment and fireworks every week. There is a very atmospheric harbour area with lots of bars, cafes and eateries. There are interesting museums, attractions and exhibitions suitable for all the family. From Weymouth there is an excellent and frequent bus service along the coast to Abbotsbury, West Bay, Bridport, Lyme Regis or even as far as Exeter. In the opposite direction the bus goes as far as Poole. The market town of Dorchester, with its Thomas Hardy connections is also easily reached by either car or bus. Portland has much to explore and there are some spectacular walks around the island. Of course you do have to visit The Bill and for those with a good head for heights you can actually go to the top of the lighthouse. For those who like their feet on terra firma the sculpture park is an interesting trip out. So there are plenty of places to explore and if you are of a certain age those bus passes can be put to good use.

The 2015 programme is published in the centre pages. There are a few changes from the 2014 programme and I will give short explanations of these:

Policy has changed at **Keswick Club Site** and will no longer accept rallies on this site during high season. We have therefore moved this popular location into the autumn period and have planned a week during September. The pitches we will use will be hard standing with electric so ideal for this time of year. This is such a well located site, within a few minutes easy flat walk into town and the local bus stand. When we last visited we were able to go all over the Lake District by bus and by being of a certain age it was all for free. It is also a lovely area for walking or cycling and of course for taking to the water. We had picnic cruises in our canoes and several really good sails in the catamaran, it was such a shame we were unable to make it this year. I suspect this will be a popular THS so get your bookings in early.

There will be no meet at the **Blackwater Sailing Club** over the late May Bank Holiday due to the tide times at this location on these dates. Although the meet in 2014 went well, for 2015 you would see mainly mud and not sea. The whole point of this location is its excellent sailing so watch out for this back in 2016. However we are in discussion with another sailing club in this area with a view to a weekend meet during 2015 so watch out in the magazine and on the website to see if this comes to fruition.

In recent years the camping area at **Pugneys** has been moved from the lakeside location we used to use. This seems to have affected the numbers booking this location or coming forward to steward this event and so it is with regret that this location is not included in the 2015 programme. However the rally area is a popular location with a number of DAs so those members who liked this venue will still have plenty of opportunity to still visit.

Rother Valley is no longer offering their rally field for us in 2015. There are plans afoot to develop a proper camping area (not adjacent to the lake) so we will keep up to date with progress on this to ascertain if this would be suitable in subsequent years.

August Bank Holiday is very late in August in 2015 which has affected some of the dates in August. The last of the three **Linch Hill** dates has moved to the middle of August and the newly reintroduced **Weymouth** is now at the very end of August running into September, but all still within the school holiday period. **Linch Hill** is always such a popular meet, especially with our younger members. Children just love the place and are happy just messing about on the water from morning till night, it is such a safe location they can learn so much and have lots of fun into the bargain. It's also a great place for novice sailors or canoeists to learn too. Lots of members bring along their grandchildren as it is such a great place and you will always get a warm welcome.

THS prices for 2015 have mainly been pegged at 2014 prices and in a couple of instances have been reduced. Your committee are aware that we are all being much more cost conscious these days and have done our best to take on board your comments.

We do need stewards for a number of meets and THSs so we do need members to volunteer to take on these. Unfortunately a number of events were cancelled last year as we did not have stewards to run them. It always seems a great pity when your committee has gone to a lot of trouble to plan events when no members come forward to give a little back to the Group. Its not hard work, we have made a lot of very good friends through running meets so go on pick up that phone or e-mail me to find out what is involved. You won't regret it.

In addition to the award the committee have added a **£75 bursary** to be spent on a water sports course or qualification. Mel died in 2008 after a long battle with cancer. He is fondly remembered by many as Editor of the Buccaneer and as an enthusiastic and knowledgeable sailor who was always prepared to cheerfully offer advice on sailing matters. The Mel Shore trophy was commissioned and made by Mike Wooldridge and first presented at our 40th anniversary meet.

The award is open to any young person (under the age of 18) who is a child or grandchild of a Boating Group member. Please send all entries by e-mail or in writing to Colin Knight.

The Alf Gardner Trophy has been awarded to Boating Group youngsters for many years. It will be awarded to a child or grandchild of a Boating Group member (under 18 years) who achieves something special, no matter how big or small, on the water or linked to their water sport. Achievements will be considered on merit. Again the committee have added a **£75 bursary** to be spent on a water sports course or qualification towards waterborne training.

Alf Gardner was an early member of the Boating Group from 1973 until his death in 1978. He was one of many members of the Mirror Association who joined us when we arranged joint rallies. He was an enthusiastic sailor supporting events in the Midlands and nationally. The trophy in memory of Alf was agreed in 1978 -9 and was carved by committee member Bill Lee with the brass work arranged by Colin Edwards. The trophy was originally presented at the Rutland meet to the crew (under 16) who had the best results competing in the Rutland regatta which was held during our meet at that time. . We understand that he missed our first Rutland meet due to ill health. If any members have any further memories of Alf we would love to hear them.

Nominations can be made by stewards, parents or relatives. Again send all nominations to Colin Knight, in writing or by email.

BOATING GROUP EVENTS PROGRAMME

General Information.

The meets programme for 2015 is printed for your reference. Please contact the steward for the latest situation regarding fees, availability, directions etc., before booking. If you haven't been to a BG meet before the procedure is simple.

For **Temporary Holiday Meets (THS)** send your booking form (see P.35) with a cheque made payable to the CCC Boating Group to the meets steward (unless specified otherwise) ASAP (and an SAE (if you are not on email) for their reply). If all the places have gone the steward will contact you. You can then either have your cheque back & book another meet or be kept on the waiting list. You can avoid this inconvenience by telephoning –or emailing – the steward first (**recommended**) to confirm a place is available & book it-but you must then send in the cheque (or fee by BACS) & form straight away otherwise you will lose your place (in fairness to other members). **If paying by BACS please include the App Code in the reference-it is included in the meet info –it ends ‘/ 2015’.**

For **weekend & 5 day meets** you are advised to email or phone the steward first to register your interest and make sure a place is put aside for you (if booking is necessary), then send in a booking form (they can be emailed). **Do not send in any money** (unless specified) with your booking form as fees are usually collected in cash on site.

Remember!! If you have booked a meet and you have to cancel for whatever reason **please, please** tell the steward at once. Whether you have paid any money or not is irrelevant. It is polite to email or phone and cancel, since many sites have limited spaces the stewards will almost certainly be able to fill your vacancy from their waiting list if given fair warning. Remember, play fair, one day it could be you on the waiting list!

To contact a steward see P.22. Also look at the committee and contacts pages near the back of the Buccaneer and contact Beryl Ireland, the Chairman of the Meets Management Committee if you would consider stewarding one of these – or any meets in the future. We are always pleased to receive offers of help with stewarding and there is a 'Meet Pack' & 'Spreadsheet' for each site which makes the whole job a lot easier. Without stewards there would be no meets and it really isn't that difficult to do. The work of our existing stewards is highly valued and appreciated.

Please note that the fees in the meet details are for a 'unit' of two adults and two children, extra persons *may* have to be paid for.

We seek them here, we seek them there –DO YOU know anyone who could volunteer to — join our committee???? —or —steward a meet?????

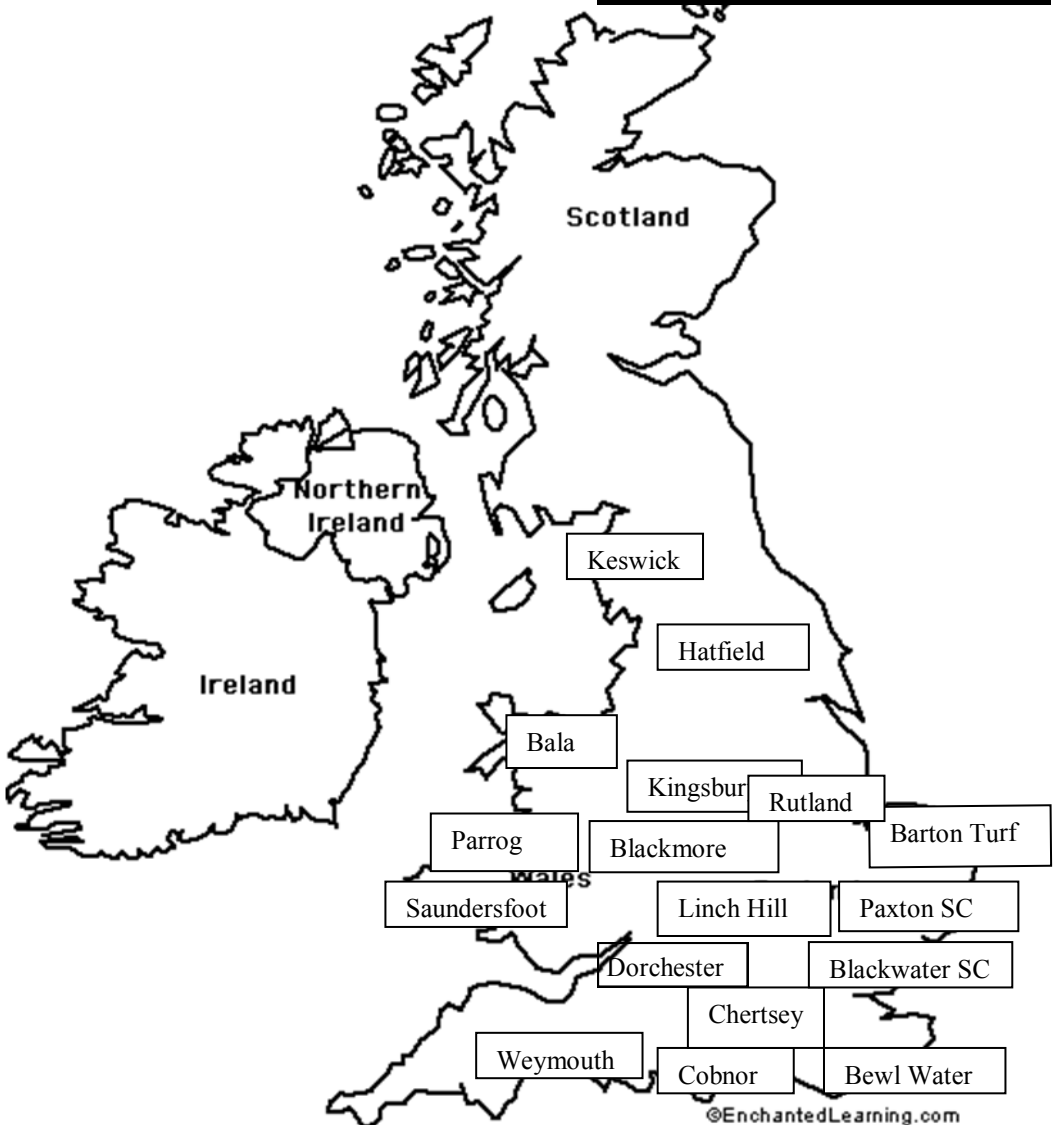
MEETS LOCATION MAP

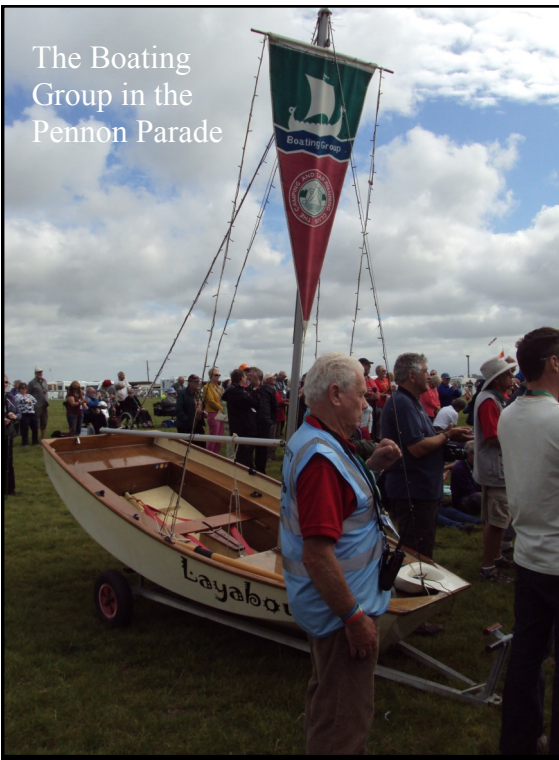

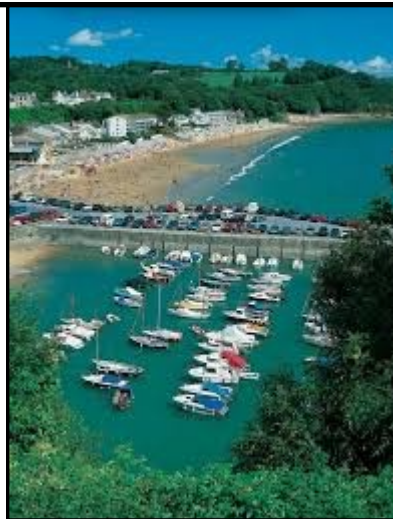
