THE MEL SHORE & ALF GARDNER TROPHIES

Attention ALL Boating Group Young People, their Parents and Grandparents

There are 2 Trophies available to Boating Group Young People or Grandchildren under 18 years at the time of submitting the entry

The ALF GARDNER Trophy

Alf Gardner was an early Boating Group member who was active in the Group sailing a Mirror Dinghy. His wish was to encourage our younger sailors so he gave the Trophy to be awarded annually to the winner of a race for under 18's. The race was a proper hour long event run under RYA rules over a typical sailing course, it used to be sailed at what was then the Boating Group's biggest meet on Rutland Water. The event was very fiercely contested by the Boating Group teenagers, many taking part over several years and finally winning it just before their 18th Birthday. It was regarded as a great honour to have this lovely trophy for a year and to have your name engraved on it in perpetuity. It was awarded annually between 1979 and 1995.

Unfortunately, new insurance rulings meant that the Boating Group were no longer insured to run any activities on the water so after a lapse of 15 years the Boating Group Council decided to award the Trophy annually to a Young Person who, in the eyes of a BG member, had achieved "something special" connected with sailing or other water activities. The field is wide open for nominations for activities as varied as: - organising racing for a Sailing Club; becoming an instructor and using the skills gained to help other YP; reliably and regularly giving time to help their sailing club with Rescue Boat duties; becoming a County Schools Sailing Champion; helping a sailor in difficulties etc. The Trophy, which can only be won once, comes with a Bursary for £75 towards a Water Based course or activity.

The MEL SHORE Trophy

Mel Shore was an active member of the Boating Group. For many years, he was a familiar figure sailing his inflatable Tinker at meets. He was a very good editor of the *Buccaneer*, greatly improving its appearance and content. Mel unfortunately 'died in office'; just a few weeks after attending the Feast of Lanterns with the Boating Group.

In his memory, the Mel Shore Trophy was instigated in 2011 to be awarded annually to a Young Person who submitted the best article published in the *Buccaneer* each year. The article can be about activities at a Boating Group meet or something else related to sailing or water based activities. Again, the Trophy is awarded annually, can only be won once, and comes with a £75 Bursary towards a water based course or activity.

Please Boating Group members can you encourage your young people to submit suitable articles or send us your nominations for the Alf Gardner Trophy.

Entries for both Trophies should be submitted to Colin Knight, any time although the entries are judged, by a sub-committee in the week before the AGM. Entries for Mel Shore Trophy must be submitted in time for them to be published in any issue of the *Buccaneer* during the year. The sooner the better! Entries should include a note of Name and Date of Birth. While there is no minimum age it should be remembered that the Bursary must be used within the year following the award and many courses are only open to unaccompanied children over 8 years of age, the bursary could however be used for swimming lessons if other suitable courses are unavailable.

The committee reserve the right not to award the Trophies if they consider there are insufficient entries of a deserving standard.

Cobnor is a minimum facility site for all units and your own sanitation is essential. There are good launching facilities for boats up to 16' into Chichester Harbour. But regrettably no boats larger than this, multihulls or windsurfers are allowed to launch. Chichester Harbour offers some great sailing, canoeing or small craft under engine with locations such as Dell Quay or Bosham being ideal destinations. There are also a variety of picnic destinations for expeditions out. Lovely walks from the site and also great country lanes for quiet bike rides.

To find the site, turn off the A27 on to the A259, turn left into Chidham Lane, almost opposite the Bosham (Beefeater) just **before** Nutbourne, if travelling west. If travelling East, it's just after, at the end of Chidham Lane (1.2M) turn left into a private road marked **Cobnor Farm and House**. The site is through the farmyard past Gerald Daniel and Cobnor Activity Centre, then 50 yards on the right. Booking not essential but phone call or e-mail to stewards would be appreciated.

Stafford Boat Club is situated on Staffordshire and Worcestershire Canal, and nestled in the picturesque Penk Valley, approximately 3 miles from Stafford town centre. The area is close to many tourist attractions, so there is plenty to explore. Check out the “visitstafford.org” website for a full list of what to see and do.

The meet is for a full 5 days, opening at 13.00 on 19th April and closing at 12.00 on the 24th April. You are welcome to attend for all or any of these days.

Camping is all on grass. Electric available. Toilet and shower facilities are available at the clubhouse. Boating is available in the canal (insurance and license required – Canal & River Trust (from £5) and launching for motor boats is possible from the club slipway (from £25).

The boating group will be holding a **Stewards forum** on the Saturday morning, and the **Boating Group AGM** on the Saturday afternoon, followed by a ‘bring and share’ supper in the evening. The Club’s annual **Cooking Competition** will be held on Sunday. There will be a full programme of other social activities provided, and the clubhouse bar will also be open during the evenings.

General Information.

The meets programme for 2018 is printed for your reference. Please contact the steward for the latest situation regarding fees, availability, directions etc., before booking. If you haven't been to a BG meet before the procedure is simple.

For **Temporary Holiday Meets (THS)** send your booking form (see P.36) with a cheque made payable to the CCC Boating Group to the meets steward (unless specified otherwise) ASAP (and an SAE (if you are not on email) for their reply). If all the places have gone the steward will contact you. You can then either have your cheque back & book another meet or be kept on the waiting list. You can avoid this inconvenience by telephoning –or emailing – the steward first (**recommended**) to confirm a place is available & book it-but you must then send in the cheque (or fee by BACS) & form straight away otherwise you will lose your place (in fairness to other members). **If paying by BACS please include your 'family name' and the App Code in the reference-it is included in the meet info –it ends '/ 2018'.**

For **weekend & 5 day meets** you are advised to email or phone the steward first to register your interest and make sure a place is put aside for you (if booking is necessary), then send in a booking form (they can be emailed). **Do not send in any money** (unless specified) with your booking form as fees are usually collected in cash on site.
